G-300 Intermediate Incident Command System and G-400 Advanced ICS, Command and General Staff-Complex Incidents (No Cost Training)

<u>Course Description</u>: G-300 & G-400 provides training on and resources for personnel who require more advanced application of the Incident Command System (ICS).

G-300: The basic concepts presented in I-200 are expanded and discussed in detail. The single command organization is stressed and students will be exposed to resource management and the role and function of each ICS position, including air operations. Through a series of small group exercises students will be provided examples of how the essential system principles and components are used in incident planning.

G-400: The Advanced Incident Command System, Command and General Staff-Complex Incidents course provides training on and resources for personnel who require advanced application of the ICS. This course expands upon information covered in IS 100 through G-300 courses.

<u>Target Audience</u>: Individuals who may assume a supervisory role in incidents. Note: During a Type 3 incident, some or all the Command and General Staff positions may be activated, as well as Division/Group Supervisor and/or Unit Leader level positions. These incidents may extend into multiple operational periods.
