MATH & SCIENCE

This month in science biology students explored the microscopic world by learning how to properly prepare and plate slides of both plant and animal cells. Using microscopes, students identified key cellular structures and compared the similarities and differences between cell types through hands-on observation and lab practice. Chemistry students put their dimensional analysis skills to work in the kitchen by applying measurement conversions and ratios to create homemade fudge. Through this activity, students connected real-world cooking applications to chemistry concepts while practicing precision, problem-solving, and mathematical reasoning.

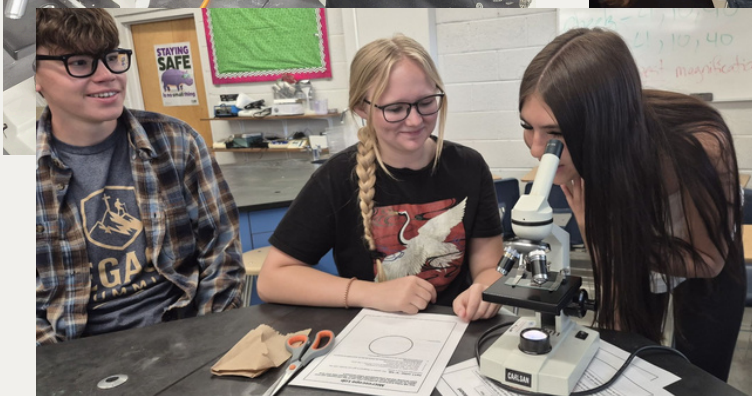

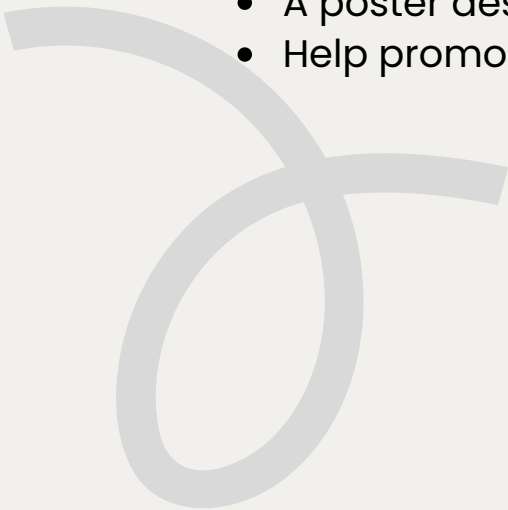


The Class of 2028 is hosting a Craft Fair outside at the Jeanne Dini Theater on Saturday, September 19!
