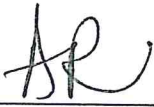

District Manager's Report

For June/July, 2026

Well we've gone from REALLY busy in June, with the snowmelt and full decree, to almost no work, pretty much back to drought mode by the end of July. Lots of driving and checking with very few treatments.

We did an excellent job, while we had water, we only received 8 calls for adulticide services. We larvicided over 800 acres including a 290 acre aerial granular treatment, that was a total success. We were able to treat the entire west side wetlands, ay MVWMA. That application as well as intense mosquitofish plantings, pretty much eliminated all the mosquito issues I was having in the northern valley areas!!

This year we moved A LOT of mosquitofish, around 25,000 so far, this season. We planted every water we possibly could at the MVWMA, as well as our usual farm and yard sites. Many of the sites are drying down now, but were there is water we have fish in place! And were it's drying, the birds are having a buffet!

Currently there has not been any arbovirus detection in northern Nevada. I will be trapping mosquitos next week and hopefully I will get enough to submit, or not if we've done a fantastic job! Our culex population is way down, we are seeing some Anopheles mosquitos, with the increase in well water usage but it's the Culex mosquitos that concern us as a public health threat, with their ability to vector several different arboviruses.

Great news! Raley's has resumed stocking dry ice here locally. Logistically getting dry ice has been a nightmare the past few years, having to get it from Reno or Fallon. I can't trap without it, it's the bait! Now again we have a local supply, a big plus for our surveillance program!

Also, NIC went off without any mosquitos attending!!! I took care of it.
